Wiltshire Freemasonry

We're off to Salisbury Cathedral to celebrate.

Assistant Provincial Grand Master Stephen Bridge reminds us that in less than four weeks time on Sunday 3rd September Wiltshire Freemasons will be present in Salisbury Cathedral to give thanks for 300 years of freemasonry and to do so in a location that represents the very best of the art of operative masons with all the mutual symbolism that it shares with the Craft. Some Brethren have raised the question as to why we are not able to parade through the streets and into the Cathedral. There are a number of perfectly legitimate administrative reasons including those raised by the Cathedral authorities, one of which is that we are attending a public service (evensong) and not a service specific to freemasonry. We would still be holding the service whether or not regalia was permitted and the fact that we have been permitted to wear our regalia at the service, represents in my view the very positive attitude the Dean and others have of Wiltshire Freemasons and what we are doing in our Province. Stephen says *"For any organisation based on voluntary membership to have existed for 300 years is of itself a subject for celebration and I believe we should hold our heads high and enjoy the opportunity to extol the virtues of freemasonry at this very special event. I am persuaded that Brethren throughout the province should dwell on what has been achieved and what may yet may be possible in the future if we see a substantial number of Brethren present on the 3rd September"*. There is still time to notify Phil Still of your intention to attend and I am told a few places are available at the post service reception which costs £10 per person. However, I'm afraid there will be no opportunity available to join your friends at the reception if you do not pre book with phil.still@btinternet.com and pay your £10 by Monday 14th August .

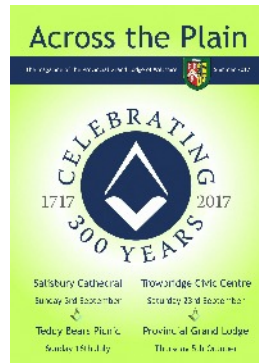

Having experienced some of the hottest evenings in memory when Lodge Rooms were more like hot houses it would have been quite natural if a decision to adopt shirt sleeve order was made, and in some corners of the United Kingdom ‘jackets off’ was authorised and reluctantly observed. However, some things are a little too avant garde and a change to the dress code is one, so no waistcoats and gloves off was probably as ‘good as it was going to get’. And yet I heard no plaintiff cries suggesting the dress rules should be relaxed or broken, quite the contrary. Albeit air conditioning was mentioned.

One of the questions often asked by new Freemasons and even the not so new is “when can I wear stripey trousers?” It should come as no surprise that this subject is covered in Graham Redman’s excellent book *Masonic Etiquette Today* of which I have a signed copy. Bro Redman begins by citing an extract from a 1950’s Report by the Board of General Purposes. “Masters of Lodges should by example and encouragement lead their members to a standard of dress compatible with the dignity of the Order”. He then points out that UGLE offers no hard and fast rule as to what a Brother wears in his Lodge, such ‘advice’ generally being proffered by the Provincial Grand Master. In Wiltshire matters on dress could not be clearer with evening dress, morning dress or a dark suit with a white shirt and black shoes being considered appropriate for everyone.
