This year the format of the meeting will be slightly different in that the Pro Grand Master will appoint and invest Andrew Tiffin, Mike May and Des Morgan to the Grand Rank of Past Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies (PAGDC) and in the case of David Henery, promote him to Past Junior Grand Deacon (PJGD). The honours are additional to those conferred at the Annual Investiture Meeting in April and reflect the importance of the Tercentenary. After the formal proceedings of Grand Lodge, David, Michael, Andrew and Des will be hosting a lunch for forty Brethren at The Honourable Artillery Company Mess in the City of London (with many thanks to Colin Cheshire who is sponsoring the lunch). I am certainly looking forward to enjoying the day with them.

If a day can be special, what about a year? For Royal Sussex Lodge of Emulation No.355 this is a very special year as in 2018 they celebrate a remarkable milestone in Swindon's Masonic history; having enjoyed a 200 year continuous presence in the town. I am sure you will give Simon your wholehearted support and join me in congratulating him on his well deserved appointment.

I am constantly amazed at the far reaching tentacles of what we refer to as social media and in particular the Provincial Twitter site. To give you an example, I was delighted to receive an online message enquiring about Col Sir Thomas Fowke who was PrGM for two years between 1775 and 1777. Mrs Valerie Oxley is researching Thomas Fowke whose father Lieut. Gen. Thomas Fowke owned Park Hill, Firbeck, Yorkshire in 1753 before he went to become the Governor of Gibraltar. When searching the Provincial website Valerie saw the sketch of Fowke which is featured in the montage of Wiltshire's PrGMs. We were very happy to provide Valerie with a copy of the image which she intends to feature in her societies newsletter. Valerie tells me that Thomas Fowke and his wife are mentioned in a journal she has which is dated 1782 - 1785 written by Amelia Staniforth who lived at Firbeck Hall. It was also interesting to discover that Valerie's father was a Leicestershire Freemason and her husband is a member of Old Peterite Lodge in York.
