

May is a very busy month for members of the Provincial team with no less than seven Installation meetings taking place. I am always grateful for the incredible support given by the active officers, who turn out to support to David, Stephen and myself, and to support the various Lodges by making the Installation meeting 'that little bit special. To every Brother who has accepted an appointment to active office and who will be invested on **Thursday 4th October** at City Hall, Salisbury; I do ask that you make every effort to fulfil the commitment you made when accepting active office by attending as many Installation meetings as you can in support of the Provincial team, also to attend the Officer's dinner. I am sure you will enjoy every moment.

The Companions of The Holy Royal Arch hold their Annual Convocation in the Assembly Rooms at Melksham on **Saturday 12th May** at **11.00am**, and I know the Most Excellent Grand Superintendent John Reid ad his officers will be delighted to welcome you to Melksham for what is always a wonderful occasion.

I do look forward to attending the annual meeting of Lodge secretaries and directors of ceremonies which is being held at The Masonic Hall in Chippenham on Friday 18th May at 7.30pm. Veronica Mannings a glorious tribute.....

It's not often that Veronica Mannings has been tongue tied and short of a ready word, but a rather special event organised by the ladies of the Chippenham and District Branch of the Wiltshire Masonic Widows Association left her quite speechless. Following some meticulous planning by Sylvia Sutton and the assistance of Veronica's daughter Jane and her husband; Veronica believed she was being taken to a local hostelry to celebrate Jane's birthday. Little did she know what was planned for her day.

The Provincial Grand Master and the Master of St Edmund Lodge welcomed Veronica and her family before escorting her into a full to capacity dining room at Calne Masonic Hall, where the assembled friends rose to greet her with a round of applause.

During the course of the luncheon a number of tributes were made to Veronica including one from Andy Bell who as the Provincial

Grand Almoner was asked by the then PrGM Brian Edwick to set up the Wiltshire Masonic Widows Association.

Andy recalled that "The commencement of the Chippenham Branch involved my wife, Karen and I meeting Veronica at her home and it was immediately clear that Veronica was a lady with a mission. I wasted no time in getting the ball rolling obtaining details from all the Lodge Almoners of their Widows and writing to them, valiantly supported by my wife as Secretary. The Chippenham inaugural meeting took place on 25th September 2001 and it won't surprise you to hear that Veronica was elected as Chairman on that day unopposed. I have never underestimated the role of the MWA and its impact as a force for good, and we especially recognise today the outstanding contribution made by Mrs Veronica Mannings, its Chairman, to its success over the past 16 years".

Philip Bullock PrGM paid his own tribute saying -"Veronica embodies the very essence of service and has proven to be an inspirational chairman, she truly deserves the accolades heaped on her today, and long may she continue to lead and guide this most successful branch of the Wiltshire Masonic Widows Association".

Brethren - be upstanding (I hope you are) but.....

How often have you smiled as the Director of Ceremonies utters this well known instruction and you think to yourself does he just mean 'stand up' and if he does, why doesn't he just say so. This is a topic I often hear being discussed at the supper table and occasionally it can lead to a keen debate as to the grammatical accuracy of the term and its use in calling the Brethren 'to order' to greet senior Brethren.

The word 'upstanding' is normally employed as an adjective describing or naming an attribute to a noun, therefore it could properly be used as follows "John is an upstanding person" where John is being described as principled, upright and decent, rather than that John is standing up. While it is certainly not wrong to use it as a command for the Brethren to stand, the command exists in the Emulation ritual, I wonder what we would say if the next instruction issued was for the Brethren to be 'downsitting'. I suspect we might adjudge that to be incorrect terminology and enjoy a quiet chuckle. For me, the simple command 'To Order Brethren' should be sufficient to get us to our feet and ready to obey the next instruction. What do you think?

Make mine a double?.....

What is it about the suggestion that a Lodge should consider undertaking a double ceremony which leads to an attack of the heebie jeebies and an urgent need to pass the smelling salts? What dreadful potential outcomes could possibly justify the concerns expressed by some as the basis for rejecting doing doubles? Let's look at what has happened in the recent past and put to rest once and for all the canard that 'we don't do doubles' - to which it should be asked, what never, never ever?



Well, you may be surprised to know that doubles in all three degrees, and particularly in Wiltshire, are far more common that you might imagine. I was recently reading the 'ancient minutes' of Border Lodge No.3129 which clearly proved that they not only did doubles, but after a short break returned to the Lodge Room to undertake a different ceremony! Indeed Gooch Lodge No.1295 can boast of having Initiated five new Masons at one meeting, raised four at another and passed two at yet another: the icing on the cake was surely when the newly Installed Master Initiated a candidate on the evening of his Installation, something akin to heresy today. In recent years (1964) Lodge of Remembrance No.4037 Initiated two gentlemen on the same evening, one of whom became the Assistant Provincial Grand Master of Wiltshire; which suggests he was not too discombobulated by having to share his 'special day'. It is this 'special occasion' element which is used by some to justify their argument to not do 'doubles' thankfully this is no justification at all, just an opinion formed on the basis of 'what they believe'. The numerous double Initiations undertaken offer no evidence of a sense of disappointment on the part of the Initiate, on the contrary it appears that Brethren who share their day are 'joined at the hip' forever, even to the point of asking whether or not they can be Passed together and ultimately Raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason.

Their shared experience in being Initiated together marks their Masonic journey as a joint enterprise, their future in Freemasonry is strengthened by an invisible bond which has been formed in the crucible of the regularity of their Initiation, strict examination and the willingness to be examined when properly called on. Their appetite for learning is founded on a desire to help each other, as is their commitment to a regular attendance at Lodge and the support of the activities of the Lodge. I think that we would all agree that Interdependent people combine their own efforts, with the efforts of others to achieve their greatest success.

Moonraker Lodge No.8747 meeting at Devizes have performed two double Initiation ceremonies , and I was privileged to attend the one held in April. Having spoken with both candidates, I am left in no doubt that they were thrilled to 'be done together'. They sat together at the festive board where they enjoyed the company of the Master and the Provincial Grand Master. How wonderful it will be for them to forever say 'mine was a double'.
