Just Ask campaign is up and running.....

Interested in Wiltshire Freemasonry?



In July the Provincial Grand Master Philip Bullock launched the 'Just Ask' campaign and endorsed the publication of a new leaflet which seeks to answer a few of the many questions asked by men attracted to Freemasonry. The colourful leaflet is not intended to be a complete reference work on Wiltshire Freemasonry or of the Craft in general, rather its aim is to invite the inquirer to 'Just Ask' for more information. The cover design and content is deliberately neutral and does not use images of Freemasons, It is anticipated that when the 'Just Ask' leaflet is given to an interested person, a friendly local Freemason will be on hand to give a little 'sales' pitch, and engage with the person and answer their questions.

Removing White Gloves - the rule.....

On a recent Lodge visit made during the very hot weather the question was asked- could the Brethren remove their white gloves (amazingly you do feel noticeably cooler without them). Permission was granted, but the decision was greeted with some very odd looks; so what is the rule ?

Let us start with answer to the question, which is there really is no rule only guidance. The Deputy Grand Secretary Graham Redman a most reliable guide on Masonic style, writes in his book on 'Masonic Etiquette' (p.28) that '*in Grand Lodge white gloves are an essential part of a Brother's regalia and are regarded as such in the majority of private lodges - but [in the latter] gloves do not have to be worn...' A Report by the Board of General Purposes dated 10th June 1964 sets out the Grand Lodge guidelines:*

'It is left to the discretion of the Master of each Lodge to decide, after considering the interests of the members generally, whether to request that they be worn. When such a request is made it should include all present and not only the officers. If gloves are worn they should be worn at all times except:

- By Candidates for the three Degrees throughout the ceremony,
- By the Master Elect when actually taking his Obligation on the V.S.L.

There is no objection to Entered Apprentices and Fellowcraft wearing gloves when not actually being Passed or Raised.' Apprentices and Fellowcraft are not obliged to wear gloves until after they are Raised although if it is the Lodge tradition then they should always comply.

Several points arise for a Master's consideration. While the default position of Grand Lodge is 'gloves are to worn', as they can be optional in a Provincial lodge the onus is on the Master/Secretary out of courtesy to visitors to include this requirement on the Lodge Summons: e.g. 'Dark Suit and White Gloves.

So back to the issue of hot hands- while some Brethren may be discombobulated by the practice of removing gloves in the Lodge room, It has often been customary on warm days for the Master to indicate that Brethren *may* remove their gloves. The advice proffered is that either all present or none should remove their gloves, with a form of phrasing which might well be: '*The Temple (Lodge Room) is very warm, Brethren, let us* all *remove our gloves'*. After all, we are all Brothers equally entitled to the same regard.
