
## Our charity evening was a great success.

## Ian Priest names local charities who will share £50,000.

Ian Priest Provincial Grand Charity Steward has revealed the names of the four charities which will benefit from the Community Awards 2017, they are SMASH, the Bobby Van Trust, the John McNeill Opportunity Centre and the Hope Nature Trust.

A sum of £3 million has been committed to support 300 local and regional charities, and Wiltshire has been allocated four grants.

Each of the four charities will compete for a share of £50,000 made up of individual awards for £25,000, £15,000, £6,000 or £4,000. 
