
## Will you join us at Salisbury Racecourse?

## So, is it Ruling or Reigning Masters or something else?



**"You think I know"**

In the Summer edition of *Across the Plain* an advertisement for the forthcoming dinner for Masters and Immediate Past Masters caused a 'bit of a kerfuffle' and it wasn't simply due to the wrong date being given! What was it that caused such a furore? The query was whether or not the terms ruling or reigning master were correct and should they ever be used. I know this is a point for debate and even robust argument over a bread roll at the festive board, so I thought we should briefly examine the matter. The term ruling or reigning Masters is sometimes heard when the Lodge Director of Ceremonies invites Brethren to join the procession out of the Lodge. Sometimes he may say ruling masters, very occasionally you may hear the term reigning masters and more frequently the term, masters of other Lodges, so which, if any is correct? I think we can safely say that the term 'reigning master' is the least attractive as no master 'reigns' - that honour being wholly reserved to a monarch or sovereign. As for ruling master, well it could be argued that it has some merit as we are reminded that a Master rules and directs his Lodge, it is also the case that the newly installed Brother becomes Master of the Lodge and a ruler in the Craft. The Worshipful Master is constrained to act in accord with the Constitutions of Masonry and the By Laws of the Lodge. On that basis and the fact that there can only ever be one Master of a Lodge (all other Masters being Past Masters) it seems logical that the most appropriate designation should be Masters of other Lodges or maybe Masters in office.
