The fabulous four make an entrance.....

The Brethren of Sarum Lodge No.5137 were really on top form for Super Saturday.

Initiating four young men into Freemasonry isn't new, even in Wiltshire (just ask Lodge of fidelity No.663) but performing two doubles on the same day is still very different to what could be described as the usual way of doing things.

Some Lodges resist the idea of doing 'double' ceremonies even though the records show that they have always been a part of Lodge life, and some Brethren may perceive this as 'conveyor belt Masonry' while others will observe that the Covid-19 virus prevented many excellent candidates from being initiated in 2020 and the first half of 2021.

Wiltshire Freemasonry has a backlog of good candidates to welcome into the Order, and it's only right that exceptional steps should be taken to resolve the impasse. It's certainly not a new or innovative process. Neither is it derogatory to the new Initiates, who to a man have made it clear that they are thrilled to have been received into the Craft during the Covid-19 crisis. The Provincial Grand Master attended the quadruple Initiation ceremony and said: "I was simply amazed at how the Lodge managed the process. Each of the new members was treated with enormous respect, and the look on each face told me that they were all thrilled to have played a key role in Sarum's Super Saturday."

Attract; Engage; Retrieve....

The United Grand Lodge of England is very clear in its view that Freemasons are part of a members' organisation, and the issue of membership remains at the heart of their strategic thinking. Indeed, the Deputy Grand Master has made it quite clear that the ultimate focus of the UGLE is "on attracting new members."

The UGLE Communications directorate has produced a new, informative leaflet intriguingly titled Members' Pathway level 1, which will be sent to all members in the next edition of FMT.

As part of the new Pathway experience the Pro Grand Master Peter Lowndes has stated that we are no longer to use the words recruit / recruitment and instead should use the word "attract / attraction" in all literature. The aim of this requirement is to create a real sense of 'alignment' with a consistent and coherent approach that is vital if an organisation is to translate ambition into action, and to communicate effectively with one voice. - How do we present Freemasonry to prospective members?
- How do we support new and existing members, so all meetings are enjoyable, expectations met and they remain actively involved?


