October is such a beautiful month....

What makes Simon's appointment so very special is that he will be following in the steps of his father VW Bro Maurice Leighfield who was invested as Deputy Provincial Grand Master in 1991 - thirty years ago. I am also delighted to be appointing Phil Still (Stonehenge Lodge No.6114) to the office of Assistant Provincial Grand Master. In appointing Simon, and Phil I know that the immediate future of the Province is in safe hands, and that events planned for the coming years will be managed spectacularly well.

It will be a pleasure to welcome and congratulate the Brethren receiving a Provincial promotion, and to recognise those Brethren who will be receiving their first Provincial Grand Rank appointment. I know just how important attaining Provincial Grand Rank is for every Brother, and I trust the value associated with the honour will be recognised by the attendance at Trowbridge of those being invested.

Sadly, there is one change which we have had to make due entirely to the uncertainty of numbers attending, and the seating capacity of the hall. This year we are not able to welcome the Masonic widows, or partners of those Brethren receiving a promotion, or first appointment. However, we will review the situation, and subject to the venue for Provincial Grand Lodge we may be able to do things differently in 2022.

Last month I suggested that the Province is nothing if not innovative, and this year's Provincial Grand Lodge meeting will demonstrate just how we 'think outside of the box'. Mark Fuller was full of praise for the staff at Springboard in Chippenham when he presented a cheque for £500 to the charity. Mark said - "We are very pleased to support Springboard as they do such fantastic work for children and their families."



The charity recently opened its new play area and Assistant Provincial Grand Master Simon Leighfield joined invited guests as Springboard Patron Lady Lansdowne cut the ribbon to declare the play area well and truly open.

The Masonic Charitable Foundation made a grant of £15,000 to assist Springboard operate a specialist preschool for children aged 2-5 offering care and education for children with additional needs.

Springboard Staff are specifically trained to deal with any specialist medical needs children under their care might have.

Springboard also run a stay and play 'Rabbits' session for children (aged 2 and under) their carers and siblings.

What is the Armed Forces Covenant?

The Armed Forces Covenant is more than just a mere promise, it is a pledge that as Freemasons, and as citizens we acknowledge and understand that those who serve or who have served in the armed forces, and their families, should be treated with fairness and respect in the communities, economy and society they serve with their lives.

The covenant focuses on helping members of the armed forces community have the same access to government and commercial services and products as any other citizen.

This support is provided in a number of areas including: education and family well-being; having a home; starting a new career; access to healthcare; financial assistance, and discounted services.

The covenant supports serving personnel, service leavers, veterans, and their families. And is fulfilled by the different groups that have committed to making a difference.

These include: Central government, overseen by the Ministerial Covenant and Veterans Board. Single services (Royal Navy, British Army, Royal Air Force). Businesses of all sizes, Local government, Charities, Communities, and Cadet forces and their adult volunteers.

If you are a member of the armed forces, a veteran, or a family member, the Armed Forces Covenant offers a wide variety of support to ensure you are being treated fairly.

The Provincial Grand Master Philip Bullock will sign the Armed Forces Covenant on behalf of all Wiltshire Freemasons. The Covenant will also be signed by a senior officer on behalf of the Armed Forces.

We are sure all Freemasons will support this initiative which is being rolled out across every Province in the country, and which will be led by HRH The Duke of Kent KG, GCMG, GCVO



"As a general rule, a dispensation should be read immediately before the proceeding which it authorises. The exception being when the dispensation authorises the meeting itself – which MUST be read immediately after the Lodge has been opened and BEFORE any business is transacted."
