December's chill wind heralds winter....



One of my favourite pieces of seasonal music is the evocative 'In the Bleak Mid Winter' written by Christina Rossetti as a poem but more commonly performed as a Christmas carol. The poem was published, under the title 'A Christmas Carol.' The composer Gustav Holst of 'The Planets' fame composed a setting of Rossetti's words (titled "Cranham") which is sung throughout the world. However, it is Harold Darke's 1909 composition which is widely performed by choirs, and in popular polls is regularly named as one of the best Christmas carols of all time. I thought it right, given the time of year, to use another verse of a poem by Rossetti to remind us that Christmas is only a few short weeks away.

Sadly, the most recent announcement by the Government has cast a dark shadow and it now looks as though Christmas 2021 will not be as anticipated. A new variant of the Coronavirus which has been called Omicron has been found in the UK, and on Friday 27 November it was declared to be in the same category as the Delta variant, which has caused waves of infection to sweep across the globe, forcing several European countries to re-enter lockdown. As a result the Prime Minister has announced a number of intermediate measures which are designed to restrict the spread of Omicron; one of which is that face coverings will be mandatory in shops and on public transport in England from Tuesday 30 November. The government has said this change will remain of force for three weeks. The wearing of face masks is **not** mandatory in a Freemason's Lodge. Should the rules change the Province will advise Lodge secretaries as quickly as possible. However, I wish to repeat my previous advice, which is that if any member feels uncomfortable about attending meetings during these trying times, they should stay at home and return to Lodge when they feel confident to do so.

On a brighter note I am looking forward to viewing the Christmas 2021 video from Corsham Lodge No.6616. I am told that rehearsals and filming has continued apace with director John Deane revealing his Alfred Hitchcock, and Stephen Spielberg producer skills. I am sure that together with Tom Snell's nifty camera work the video will be a huge success.

I was joined by a good number of Wiltshire Brethren when we had the immense pleasure of attending the Installation meeting of St Patrick's Lodge No.295 (IC). The Lodge is currently meeting at Warminster where the Royal Dragoon Guards are based.

On Wednesday 8th December I will be joined by a number of Brethren at the Christmas QC meeting at Freemasons' Hall in London. This meeting is always well attended and I anticipate this year being no exception. I often wonder how much notice is taken of the Ancient Charges, which every Master gives his 'unqualified assent' - in particular No.12. For those who can't remember, it is the clause which reads - "You promise a regular attendance on the Communications and Committees of the Grand Lodge." A promise made, but seldom kept.

After Christmas comes the New Year, I wonder if Masters in Office might take time to reflect on the promises they make prior to Installation into the Chair of the Lodge.



Thank you to all Lodge Treasurers....

Who would be a treasurer? It's an okay role until that moment when you have to advise the Lodge of an increase in subscriptions, or present the accounts to the Brethren. Every Lodge owes a debt of gratitude to the treasurer, one of only three officers elected by the Lodge. But here's a question to tax the most agile of brains, 'What are the duties of a treasurer, and where can I find a comprehensive explanation of them in the Book of Constitutions?'



The answer can be found under Rule 153 in the BoC. Fifty years ago Rule 153 consisted of a single clause, today there are five clauses; evidence if needed, to the ever changing role of this important office.

One of the questions frequently asked by the newly elected Treasurer is with regard to accounts held by the Charity Steward, and the Lodge Almoner. Do these funds come under the same rules as those governing the Treasurer? The answer quite simply is 'Yes they do' - Rule 153 (e) makes it clear that "The same procedure of annual accounts, audit and presentation to members of the Lodge shall be followed in relation to **any other funds** maintained by or in connection with the Lodge."

Wear a mask....

Following the government announcement that the wearing of face masks is to be mandatory in shops and on public transport, and in other designated spaces, the UGLE has issued guidance for Masonic meetings. As from Tuesday 30 November the wearing of face masks in Lodge meetings is **recommended** unless the Brother is exempt. The Provincial Grand Master concurs with this advice, and asks that Brethren adhere to the guidance as issued.

Members are still encouraged to undertake a lateral flow test, available free from NHS Test and Trace, prior to attending any Masonic meeting.
