Address to the Companions on the occasion of the Convocation of Provincial Grand Chapter on 14th May 2022 by the Most Excellent Grand Superintendent – E Comp John C Reid

Companions, I welcome you all here this morning and thank you for giving up your precious time to support our Annual Convocation. I have already welcomed our distinguished guests many of whom have once again travelled long distances to be with us, this truly shows the continued support we have for one another, and the enjoyment achieved through the Companionship of the Royal Arch.

On behalf of the Wiltshire Executive, I take this opportunity to thank those Province's represented here today for their most generous hospitality when we have attended their Annual Convocations, we trust your visit to Wiltshire today will be equally enjoyable and memorable.

Companions today is a special day of celebration and I congratulate all those Companions who I have had the pleasure of appointing and promoting this morning. Your preferment is in recognition of your continued contribution and commitment to both your Chapters and the Province.

I couple this with the promotion and appointment in Grand Rank of Excellent Companion Peter Read promotion to Past Assistant Grand Sojourner, and Excellent Companion Michael Taylor appointed to Past Grand Standard Bearer. One Chapter in the Province has taken their ceremony a stage further by acting out the findings in the vault, in doing so the ceremony becomes more meaningful to the candidate, as we know actions speak louder than words, Companions it certainly does add value to the ceremony. Let's not forget our meetings must be enjoyable, fun as well as retaining a sense of humour, while keeping everything in perspective, but I am sure we would all agree that a Masonic ceremony performed well, is a memorable occasion, so let us all strive to perform to the best of our ability, should your Chapter need assistance or guidance the Provincial Team is here to help, you only have to ask.



Once again Companions I thank those Chapters that have given generously in support of our "Children at Christmas" initiative, this year enabling us to assist Victim Support (Wiltshire) specifically to purchase relevant items to supplement the emotional support they provide to children and young people who have been affected by, or involved in, "Hate Crime".

We are currently liaising with Wiltshire Portage, which is an independent organisation providing a free home-visiting, specialist educational service for children up to 4 years of age with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. Working with families and their young children they provide unique learning opportunities through holistic play to help the children develop a quality of life and experience in which they can learn together, play together, participate and be included in their community.

Companions through your generosity it will enable us to purchase for Wiltshire Portage specialist resources and aids in supporting each child's individual learning path.

So, Companions it will come as no surprise that the alms collection today using the gift aid envelopes, will go towards our Relief Chest enabling us to continue to support and assist children and young adults.

Companions Supreme Grand Chapter through the Members Communication Working Party and the Regional Liaison Group are working hard behind the scenes gathering information from Exaltees, Master Mason's surveys and Grand Superintendents reports, to provide better guidance in taking the Royal Arch forward, which will lead to the production of a purposeful narrative for the Royal Arch and provide a well-structured "Archway" document in line with the Craft "Pathway". Companions this is a huge task the results of which we will not see until well into 2023.

Later in the year UGLE will be launching their Strategy for the next seven years. Having attended an overview, I can inform you that it will require buy-in from all of us to enable it to be successful, the strategy does incorporate Supreme Grand Chapter and the Royal Arch which goes to show the inextricable link that exists between the Craft and Royal Arch.

Companions I am in a privileged position to undertake many enjoyable and pleasurable tasks, today is no exception having invested a new 2nd Provincial Grand Principal and Deputy Grand Superintendent and in due time I very much look forward to investing Excellent Companion Roger Pounder as 3rd Provincial Grand Principal. Biblical timeline for the Royal Arch

The Historical Lecture opens with the line:

'Companions, there are three epochs in the history of Freemasonry which particularly merit your attention.

They are the openings of the First or Holy Lodge, the Second or Sacred Lodge, and the Third or Grand and Royal Lodge.'

Many Chapters drink to the memory of 'The Grand Originals' from these three Lodges at the festive board.

There is however a great deal to be gained from setting these moments of time in a wider context. Some

aspects of our story make more sense when we take a broader view of the history surrounding the three main epochs.

The dates on the following page set a wider context to help a greater understanding of the Royal Arch story.

Getting to know the story itself is the first step in understanding the allegory within it.

The dates are presented as both BCE (before the Common Era), and CE (Common Era).





BCE / CE (circa)	Event	Significance to the RA	
4000 BCE	Creation – the symbolic or figurative date representing creation.	Genesis: 'In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep'. The first words of the Book of Genesis.	
2000 BCE	Abraham leads the Jewish people from Babylon to Canaan (later Israel); the 'Promised Land'.	Genesis later outlines Abraham's journey of some 600 miles, from Ur to Canaan. Based upon God's Promise of 'land that I will show you' and of one day being a 'great nation' hence the 'Promised Land'.	
1750 BCE	Abraham's grandson, Jacob, (who later changed his name to Israel) and his 12 sons move to Egypt because of the famine in Canaan.	Jacob's 12 sons and grandsons became the patriarchs of the 12 tribes of Israel which are represented by the Banners in the Chapter	
1500 BCE	Moses leads the children of Israel out of captivity in Egypt. It takes 40 years for them to reach the Promised Land; then known as Canaan and later to be called Israel.	Moses, Bezaleel and Aholiab build the Tabernacle in the wilderness of Sinai at the foot of Mount Horeb. We refer to it as The First, or Holy Lodge.	
1000 BCE	Solomon, son of David, builds the First Temple with help from Hiram, King of Tyre and Hiram Abiff.	Solomon, Hiram King of Tyre and Hiram Abiff build the Temple during which the genuine secrets are lost due to the untimely death of Hiram Abiff as explained in the Third Degree in the Craft. We refer to it as The Second, or Sacred Lodge.	
586 BCE	Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon conquers Israel, destroys Jerusalem and with it Solomon's Temple. The Nobility of Judea are taken into captivity, leaving behind the peasantry to till the soil under the Babylonian-chosen Judean (Jewish) governor Gedaliah.	This is the specific event which forms the foundation of the Royal Arch story and is a major theme in the Ceremony	
582 BCE	Gedaliah assassinated. The remaining Jewish people are taken captive into Babylon.		
29 October 539 BCE	Cyrus I enters Babylon and becomes Emperor.		
538 BCE	Cyrus King of Persia lets the Jewish people and other exiles return to their native land. The Jews rebuild the Temple. Zerubbabel, Haggai, and Joshua lead the Sanhedrin in supervising this work.	Zerubbabel, Haggai and Joshua preside over the building of the Second Temple. This is the backdrop for the Exaltation Ceremony, in which the genuine secrets of a Master Mason are found by the Sojourners. We refer to this as The Third, or Grand and Royal Lodge.	
70 CE	Herod's Temple is destroyed again by th	e Romans.
