I feel sure you will agree this is a real benefit to all users, particularly as it provides a facility that enables total separation of personal emails from those related to the Lodge. Incidentally, members of the Provincial team are using @wiltshirefreemasons.org.uk as their default email address for all Masonic business. I do thank Mark Newman and Colin Froude who have been instrumental in getting this project up and running. If you have any issues setting up, please do speak to them and they will do all they can to assist.

The Province does not have access to the content of emails sent and received using the email address @wiltshirefreemasons.org.uk and all emails are private and confidential.
