I was very proud...



To join Steve Lee and six other Brethren from Wiltshire in the Grand Temple at Freemasons' Hall to celebrate and congratulate them on receiving a Grand Rank promotion and first appointments from the Pro Grand Master. Sadly, there are some in our ranks who are moved to make critical and unkind comments, designed to hurt the recipients of honours and cast doubt on the decision of the MW Grand Master's judgement. Brethren, let me be clear that I will not stand idly by when such comments are reported back to me; I will challenge those who seek to make mischief and I will invoke disciplinary procedures when justified.

Last month I asked Members to sign up to Portal. I am repeating this request and would advise that it is easy to use and it is a real benefit to your Lodge Secretary. Most importantly it puts, you the member in control of your personal data. It also allows you to view (when permitted) contact details for the members of each of the Lodges and Chapters to which you subscribe.

This year we will be celebrating the 250th anniversary of Wiltshire Freemasonry with a very special anniversary dinner on Saturday 18th October at Bowood Hotel and Country Club. The evening will be a fine dining experience with musical input from an extremely talented team of singers including Harry Apps who recently played Marius in Les Miserables in the 2019 UK and Ireland tour, and again at the Sondheim Theatre in 2020. It promises to be a wonderful evening and I am looking forward to welcoming you to Bowood, a venue well known for the quality of its cuisine and service. Places are limited to 120 and early booking is recommended.

I am delighted to advise that bookings for the third annual Carols at Christmas service at Marlborough College have reached 200 - and it's only May. This event has proved to be a 'hit' with so many of our Brethren and family members. Please do scan the QR code and let the team know you intend to attend. It may be seven months away but I for one am looking forward to those simply superb mince pies.

Last month I mentioned the PSA testing in Swindon being organised by The Loganberry Trust. I attended as did 73 men and the results were quite striking. Out of 74 men tested, 10 had elevated PSA levels and were recommended to discuss the results with their GP. We always hope the second test will allay any fears and that no further action is required, but it does suggest that this simple and inexpensive test is well worth doing. The team is in Salisbury on Saturday 10th May, so if you're not attending the Royal Arch Convocation at Melksham on the tenth, I recommend you book a PSA test at Salisbury (see page 8).

Another milestone in the history of Wiltshire Freemasonry will see Highworth Lodge No.9009 move to the Swindon Masonic Centre in September. Last year St Aldhelm Lodge No.2888 made a similar move, in their case to Chippenham; as I observed at the time, the world didn't come to an end and the Lodge is thriving in its new home. I trust the Members of Highworth Lodge and their newly Installed Master Chris Biggs will enjoy their new home and that in twelve months time they will look back and acknowledge their move to have been a great success.

Finally, a huge thank you to the Members of Vastern Lodge No.8977 and in particular Mike Bracken who delivered soft toys to the Children's Ward at Swindon's Great Western Hospital. I fully support the giving of something tangible and needed as opposed to a cheque. I am equally grateful to the Wiltshire 'Stonecutters' who had a 'ride out' in support of the Wiltshire 2028 Festival and in remembrance of Brethren that have passed to the Grand Lodge above. Thank you so much.

A change in Regulation 66...

The better to support **One Journey** - **One Organisation** and assist candidates in completing their journey in Pure Antient Freemasonry, the Committee of General Purposes considers that it is desirable to modify the process required for joining a Chapter for candidates for exaltation or joining membership. The Committee believes that the current requirement for both a proposer and seconder for a candidate to complete his journey is unnecessary and that a single subscribing member of the Chapter should instead be able to sponsor a candidate's proposal for membership. A proposal to amend the Regulation will be made in November.

"Candidates for admission into a Chapter must be duly proposed by a subscribing member of the Chapter, to whom the candidate is known personally, who will act as that candidate's sponsor. Such proposition may take place either at a regular convocation or by notice transmitted by the proposer to the Scribe E. at least fourteen days before the next convocation. For this purpose the candidate and his proposer shall supply such information, and in such format, as may from time to time be prescribed by the Committee of General Purposes. But no ballot shall take place unless the full name of the candidate, with his occupation (if any) and place of abode as well as the name of his proposer shall have appeared on the summons to the members of the Chapter. In the case of a candidate for exaltation the name and number of every Lodge of which he is or has been a member and the date on which he is or has been a member shall be shown on the summons."
