

If you invite a member of another Province to visit it is perfectly in order, and a courtesy, to advise your guest of this ruling. A Freemason should not be offended at being made aware of this and in most circumstances would be grateful for the notification. A similar principle applies when visiting a Lodge in another Province; please make yourself aware of the policy of the Province and be respectful of their wishes.

The owner, Kera Caliţa, joined our table in full period costume, reciting poetry and sharing vivid stories from the restaurant's own history, tales of bohemian gatherings, political intrigue, and the golden age of Romanian arts. A traditional band. and singer performed throughout the evening, inspiring enthusiastic participation from the Brethren.

On Saturday we attended the Lodge meeting, celebrating Fidelitatea Lodge's 5th Anniversary. The Lodge welcomed the Pro Grand Master, and Grand Secretary of the National Grand Lodge of Romania, along with several Grand and Provincial Officers, over 100 attendees in total. Following the meeting, our Lodge presented an abridged demonstration of an Initiation ceremony, which was warmly received by the Romanian Brethren with a standing ovation. The trip was truly memorable, an experience rich in fraternal spirit and international brotherly love. We now look forward to hosting Fidelitatea Lodge in the UK next year.

Litter Picking at Ludgershall is community engagement...

We have heard a lot from the Centre about the need for Freemasons to engage with their local communities, indeed many of you will have noticed that the word charity has been replaced with the word service in the four principles that identify Freemasonry, and the UGLE has cited Community Engagement as being important if we are "To cement our reputation as a force for good in our communities and society at large". Community Engagement in Freemasonry encompasses service, and its importance is diagrammatically represented by the third pillar in UGLE's overall strategy for the future of Freemasonry.

For some people community service is defined as the engagement of individuals or groups in an organised activity that contributes to the local or national community. You might feel that what service and engagement have in common is that it embraces the act of volunteering, which itself is about people working on behalf of others or a particular cause, without payment, for their time and skills.

Service is first mentioned to the new Freemason when presented with the tools of the Degree; it is recognised as something we do in the normal course of our daily life. As an individual a Freemason is charged to practice every domestic and public virtue, and to maintain those truly Masonic ornaments of Benevolence and Charity in which Benevolence is an attitude of kindness and goodwill towards others, while charity is generally regarded as the actual act of giving, often money but also time and material aid to those in need.

For Wiltshire Freemasons engaging with local communities is as natural as breathing, and is something for which we have a long and illustrious record. Whether it's providing a Big Breakfast, collecting on behalf of the Royal British Legion, volunteering as a hospital driver, helping in a charity shop or foodbank. serving on a local authority, assisting a charity, and even litter picking - Wiltshire Freemasons have **always** been at the forefront of community engagement.

Becoming a Freemason does not make a person charitable (in its wider meaning) as is made clear when the Initiate is told that charity is the "distinguishing characteristic of a Freemason's heart" and concludes with these words "no doubt it has often been felt and practised by you" - confirmation, if any was required that a man who desires to be made a Freemason is already someone for whom charity is no stranger.

We can be justly proud of the fact that our Lodges and its members recognise the difference between 'talking about something and actually doing something' and being able to appreciate that it's not a **committee** that makes things happen, it's a **commitment**.

APPOINTMENT TO PROVINCIAL GRAND RANK



The number of appointments which can be made to Provincial Grand Rank each year is limited by the Book of Constitutions and in this Province is not sufficient for one from each Lodge, each year (see Rules 67-70).

The conferment of Rank is the prerogative of, and entirely at the discretion of the RW Provincial Grand Master, whose decision may not be questioned.

The honour conferred on a Brother is that of being appointed one of the Officers, Present or Past, of the Provincial Grand Master, irrespective of the Rank of the Office.

Rank is not only a reward for past service, but is to be regarded as an opportunity and incentive for further service to Masonry.


